Sports changed each term. Pupils chose their sport on the day. Pupils’ behaviour was monitored by coaches and the expectation was that behaviour was to be exemplary. Demand was created in not having a place for everyone with a coach (310 pupils on playground).</p> <p>Purchased lunchtime team games equipment to support provision.</p>	<p>£9,400</p> <p>£1,100</p>	<p>A more positive lunchtime experience. Pupils reported feeling more safe and secure on the playground due to zoned areas of play on the playground. The demand for a place with a coach ensured behaviour was nearly always exemplary. 100% Year 6 boys participating on a regular basis. Lunchtime Organisers reported fewer ‘trips to the headteacher’. Class teachers reported improved levels in concentration and reduced low level disruption post lunchtime.</p>	<p>Maintain current success in improving behaviour using sports coaches at lunchtime.</p> <p>Extend lunchtime physical activity opportunities through training staff with lunchtime duty (Teaching assistants and Lunchtime organisers).</p>
