IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL PARENT/CARERS

At St Anthony's, we appreciate the fact that most of our pupils have excellent attendance and this should be commended. It is widely recognised that poor attendance at school has a negative impact on educational outcomes and future life chances of children. Therefore, we want to encourage parents to ensure that their child attends school every day.

We understand that there may be occasions when a pupil's attendance may be affected due to exceptional circumstances. In these cases, support and advice will always be available from the school. However, attendance levels for a minority of pupils continue to fall below the school's expectations of 97%. All pupils' attendance is closely monitored by the school and only the Headteacher has the authority to authorise any absence.

All Parents/Carers of pupils with high levels of unauthorised absence are now duly warned from the date of this letter that they may receive a penalty notice or be prosecuted in the Magistrates court. Any such penalty notice or prosecution may relate to your child's attendance record both prior to and subsequent to this letter.

Where a Parent/Carer removes their child during term-time without authorisation they may be liable for a penalty notice or prosecution in the Magistrates court. A penalty notice will be issued to each parent for each child. The penalty notice incurs a fine of £120 to be paid within 28 days, which is reduced to £60 if paid within the first 21 days.

Failure to pay the penalty notice may result in legal proceedings being taken against you. Other statutory action may also be considered under the Education Act 1996, which may result in you being prosecuted in the Magistrates' Court. If you are found guilty, you will receive a criminal record and may receive a fine of up to £2,500 and/or three months' imprisonment.

If your child is experiencing any problems that may be affecting their attendance or punctuality, then please contact the school on 0161 437 3029 to discuss any support that could be provided to ensure their regular attendance. We would also request Parents/Carers provide school with medical evidence when absence is related to illness, i.e. a copy of prescriptions or medical/appointment cards.

Once again thank you for supporting St Anthony's Catholic Primary School in improving attendance, which will ensure that all pupils in school have the opportunity to reach their full potential and improve outcomes for their future.
